

In June of this year, I received a heartfelt request for partnership in a letter from Heather Eysaman, the Principal of Rochester Academy Charter Elementary School (RACS). Heather is no stranger to our church—seeing that she grew up in First Congregational Church of Spencerport and her mother, Karen, is an active member.



In Heather's letter, she informed me of some very interesting statistics: Over 90% of the students at her school come from the Rochester City School District and are economically disadvantaged; 53% of the students are classified as chronically absent; 11% of the students are classified as special education; and the school compromises 6 different languages among its 400 students.

Furthermore, Heather informed me that two of the greatest needs for teachers and students are school supplies (e.g., backpacks, crayons, pencils, etc.) and winter gear (e.g., clothes, coats, hats, gloves, socks/underwear, etc.). Heather also informed me that many of the teachers were using their own personal finances to purchase some of these items for their students—which is not at all atypical among teachers serving an economically disadvantaged populace.

Therefore, after much prayer, discernment, and discussion, our church has decided to become an official ongoing partner of RACS. If you recall, last month we hosted a community pulled pork dinner—all the proceeds from the dinner have gone to RACS to aide teachers with school supplies for students.

Our next project as a church and community will be to collect winter gear for the students at RACS. More information about this will be coming soon.

In the meantime, I am going to ask you to do two things: 1) Pray for this new partnership; and 2) Discern in your own heart how you can play a role in this (e.g., volunteer at one of the upcoming fundraisers, volunteer to read to the elementary students, volunteer to help sort through and organize donated clothes, etc.).

Church—We have a real opportunity to make a real impact in the lives of these students (and their parents) and teachers. So, let's do it!


Notes From The Task Force

In support of the Partnership between First Congregational UCC Spencerport and Rochester Academy Charter Elementary School a Pulled Pork Dinner was held on August 6th. The net proceed of that event was \$1326. Along with Penny Jar money from June and July (\$287), generously contributed by Christian Education, and some monies from the Goebel-Zabel Account for Children we were able to present Heather Eyasman, Principal of RACS Elementary School, with \$2000 in gift cards to purchase needed school supplies for the children.

Over 90% of the students are economically disadvantaged and are unable to afford basic supplies for school; many even lack warm clothes for the winter months. In addition to the gift cards for school items, Christian Action is donating \$500 in Burlington gift cards to purchase coats, hats, mittens, and other winter gear.

We are working to enlist cooperation from the community and are planning to hold more Fundraisers to continue to assist RACS in whatever needs they may have.




